INFORMATION ON THE ACADEMY FOR COMMUNITY TOURISM (ACT)

As a tribute to the pioneering work of Diana McIntyre-Pike in community tourism, The Countrystyle Community Tourism Network/Villages as Businesses (CCTN/VAB) and the IIPT Caribbean has created an Academy for Community Tourism in honour of its President/Founder Diana McIntyre-Pike who is the President for the first chapter of the International Institute for Peace through Tourism (IIPT) outside of USA and Co-ordinator of the IIPT International Community Tourism Network.

Viewing villages from a business perspective is a holistic approach towards development through tourism. Also available is a 14-day Village Tourism Planning and Management short course for practitioners to be promoted internationally as a community tourism study tour through Countrystyle Caribbean Vacations and Tours (COCAVAT) and its tour partner CARIBIC/OLYMPIA TOURS.

Upon successful completion of this 14-day course, participants will have completed Unit 1, *Entrepreneurial Mindset*, which is the first course in the BTEC Level 2 programme entitled *Enterprise and Entrepreneurship*.

Community tourism and international training and certification are catalysts for poverty reduction, the conservation of nature and culture, better governance, and more harmonious and self-reliant communities.
